(e) At 1600, 20 October the PHILADELPHIA got underway from NAPLES enroute to MERS EL KEBIR, Algeria.

6. 21 October.

- (a) The PHILADELPHIA was steaming independently on base course 255°T, speed 22 knots enroute from the Gulf of NAPLES, Italy, to MERS EL KEBIR, Algeria.
- (b) At meritorious mast, held by the Commanding Officer, several members of the crew were commended for meritorious action in the invasion of Southern France.
- (c) During the afternoon a battle problem was conducted and the crew was exercised in various emergency drills.

1200 - 37°50: N, 6°28: E.

2000 - 37°44' N, 3°7*15" E.

7. 22 thru 26 October.

(a) The ship was steaming independently on base course 258°T, speed 21 knots enroute to MERS EL KEBIR, Algeria. Entered MERS EL KEBIR Harbor at 0816 and moored starboard side to North Jetty in berth 5 at 0830. Ships and commands present included Commander EIGHTH Fleet, SOPA, in U.S.S. EROOKLYN: U.S.S. VULCAN,
