20 to 24:

As before. 2030 General Quarters; set material condition "ABLE". 2119 Secured from General Quarters; set condition III Air, secured from material condition "ABLE", set material condition "BAKER" plus. NOTE: The following named men were casualties in action this date, and were treated in the sick bay for the following injuries. ROBERTSON, A.B. Slc, (656-53-77), compound fracture right lower leg, wound debrided and dressed, plaster cast applied. MILLER, A. Slc, (630-09-70), three small shrapnel wounds in left side of neck, dressing applied. HIDALGO, L., O.C.S., slight skin wound left arm, dressing applied, (497-86-71). WATERS, T.J. Slc, (658-12-19), wound punctured right forearm, dressing applied. MC KEETON, D., GM2c, (250-49-27), wound contused, right thigh, dressing applied.
