As before. NOTE: At 1630 this date Staff Sgt. Morris KRAVITZ, (12-026-952) 306 Service Squadron, 41 Service Group, Termini; reported aboard under verbal orders and to remain until parachutes are repacked. NOTE: The following ammunition was expended this date on the 20MM battery for test firing: 21 rounds of Lot/ 13-H, 16 rounds of Lot, 1199, 7 rounds of Lot. 1, TOTAL: 44 rounds. 1834 U.S.S. NARRAGANSETT (AT 88) standing in. 1840 U.S.S. ROWAN standing in. 1920 U.S.A. Hospital Ship SEMINOLE standing out.


