As before, 0000 Steaming along at various speeds and courses in the size Support area No.1 standing by to furnish support for Shore Fire Control parties of the 5th. U.S. Army in the vicinity of Salerno, ITALY. During the morning noted numerous flares and considerable bombing and artillery and anti-aircraft firing over the beach well inland. 0010 Stopped both engines. 0012 Using various courses and speeds to close beach. 0020 Changed speed to 3.5 knots. 0021 On firing course 335°(T), speed 3.5 knots. 0027 Commenced firing 5° shore bombardment in sector # 837-198. 0032 Ceased firing. 0035 Changed course to 160°(T). 0110 "RED" alert in south. 0200 Changed course to 070°(T). 0220 Changed course to 335°(T).0250 Changed course to 010°(T). 0255 Changed course to 335°(T). 0300 Changed course to 350°(T), observed bomb flashes bearing 000°(T). 0305 Changed course to 350°(T). 0320 Commenced firing 5"shore bombardment on sector # 837-198. 0225 Ceased firing, changed course to 160°(T).

Sky control is not on any targets; Radar plot says screen is clear. 0516 25° right rudder. 0519 Radar plot reported hostide aircraft 315°(T), 11 miles. 0520 Fighters reported one bandit flying SE. 0523 Radar plot reported 3 or 4 planes 258°(T), 5 miles. 0524 25 right rudder. Radar plot reported plane at 260°(T), 5 miles. Plane was lost overland and came out a few minutes later. 0525 Opened fire on planes closing. Changed speed to 20 knots. Planes did not come in close, no bombs were dropped during this attack. 0603 Secured from material condition "ABLE", set "BAKER" plus. 0608 Changed speed to 5 knots, steadied on course 340°(T). 0610 Secured from General Quarters; set condition II on Gunnery and Lookout stations, condition III Surface on all other stations. 0620 Steaming on various courses to take station for Fire Support of Shore Fire-Control Party No.1. 0633 Steadied on course 640°(T). 6000 Changed course to 340°(T); held supplies General Tuarters. 0725 Changed Steaming on various courses at various speeds to close 1.5
