far along the coastal area by human torpedoes, though one other attack had been reported prior to this by the U.S.S. LUDLOW and F.S. MALIN on 7 September. Also an attack by German explosive boats was reported by the H. P. JONES on the night of 7-8 September.

- (c) On 10 and 11 September, four (4) German prisonersof-war, operators of human torpedoes, were delivered to Commander
 Task Force 86 on board the PHILADELPHIA and interrogated by the
 Commanding Officer. It was revealed that two groups of six human
 torpedoes were launched west of SAN REMO, Italy; one from MORTOMA,
 and one from VENTIMIGLIA; between 2100 and 2300, 9 September;
 eleven of these were accounted for in sinkings.
- (d) Information received from three Italians, who professed to be patriots, bore out the story of the German prisoners as to the launching sites of the human torpedoes. The Italians, who lived in that area, had escaped in a fishing boat seeking to contact an Allied authority with information from their leader.
