Navy (Commander Task Force EIGHTY-SIX); a Gold Star in lieu of a Second Legion of Merit to Captain Walter Ansel, U. S. Navy; a Gold Star in lieu of a Second Legion of Merit to Captain Ransom K. Davis, U. S. Navy; and various other awards to the Staff Officers of Commander Task Force EIGHTY-SIX.
- (d) At 1515, 16 October, Rear Admiral L. A. Davidson,
