Communication Plan

1. Instructions

- (a) T.B.S. (72.5 mcs) shall be used sparingly, reserving it for contacts, emergencies and necessary transmissions during reduced visibility. Commander Task Force 86 voice code and calls shall be used, use Key Letter WILLIAM with the numeral table.
- (b) In case of T.B.S. transmitter failure acknowledge by flashing light during daylight and 2150 Kcs. W/T at night.
- (c) Communications shall be confined to visual methods so far as practicable. If it becomes necessary to use light at night, use minimum strength with directional attachment.
- (d) Man surface search radar during darkness and low visibility, air search radar as signalled. BK guard by PHILADELPHIA.
