Shopping in 19th-early 20th century style




And a 50s era Soviet style village school





Our 2nd stop was the town of Podolinec with its 16th century klastor (monastery)








Some of the furnishings are original or even predate the church itself.

As we toured the area in a slow mode of transportation




I took a photo of this little cabin. I'd be happy spending summers here.

Unlike day 1 the trip back to the hotel was uneventful


After dinner, a troop of Roma (Gypsy) dancers provided wonderful entertainment.
