I have other pictures as well. This is the family of Grandma's sister Rose. I have no idea what happened to them either



I once had similar questions about Slovakia, the land of my maternal grandparents. There had been no contact between the families since 1935 because of the depression, WWII and Communism. Because of church records I was able to reconnect with family, cousins with whom I share a common grandfather. They took me to his grave. He had returned there, bought land and built a house expecting my grandmother and mother to join him. He did not like working in the PA coal mines. "You never saw the sun"

Joe and I studied Slovak Language and Culture for 2 summers in the university in Bratislava and took our children and grandchildren to meet their relatives. Now the younger generations are all friends on Facebook.

Maybe I will be similarly fortunate when visiting Lithuania again.

However, even if it is impossible to find relatives given my lack of documents, I want to go to their village. I want to walk where they walked and see the land that they saw before leaving behind everything and everyone they knew and seeking a new life in America.


